Please donate the following:

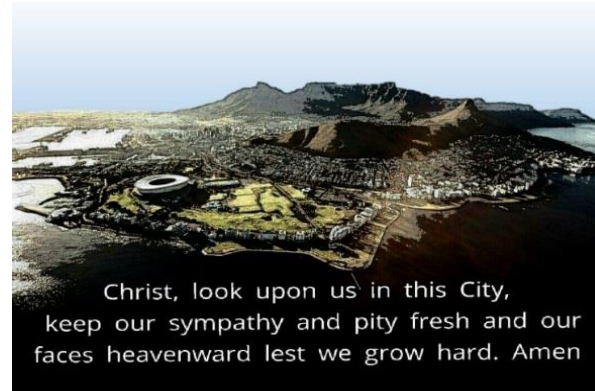
